#### WHAT IS EARLY VOTING?

Registered voters may cast a ballot prior to Election Day without having to provide a reason for wanting to vote early. This ballot is cast by personal appearance at the office of the election authority or at an early voting center.

## EARLY VOTING?

A major reason for early voting is to encourage greater participation in the election process. People who travel for business, work long hours, or are otherwise inconvenienced by the hours the polls are open on Election Day may find it easier to vote early.

## WHO CAN VOTE EARLY

Any qualified voter may vote prior to Election Day at any site established for early voting by the election authority. (10 ILCS 5/19A-5)

## WHEN CAN EARLY

The period for early voting begins the 40<sup>th</sup> day preceding an election and extends through the end of the day before Election Day. (10 ILCS 5/19A-15)

## ARE POLLWATCHERS ALLOWED AT EARLY VOTING SITES?

Yes. Like at the regular polling places on Election Day, pollwatchers may be appointed to observe early voting by personal appearance at each permanent and temporary polling place where early voting is conducted. (10 ILCS 5/19A-60)

Each election authority shall determine and publish a list of the locations, dates, and hours of each early voting site in their jurisdiction. Also, a list of early voting hours and locations will be available on the Illinois State Board of Elections' website (www.elections.il.gov) at least 10 days prior to the beginning of any early voting period.

## NPORTANT FACTS

- The votes cast during the early voting period will not be counted until after the polls close on Election Day. (10 ILCS 5/19A-50)
- Electioneering is prohibited at the early voting site and a campaign-free zone will be established like it is at the polling place on Election Day. (10 ILCS 5/19A-70)
- Curbside voting can take place at an early voting site. This is where two election judges of opposite political parties deliver a ballot to a voter in their vehicle outside of the polling place.
