Park District Overview

Annual Appropriation Budget: \$80,500

• Equalized Assessed Valuation (2024): \$3,000,000

• **Population**: Approximately 900 residents

Employees: 0 (entirely volunteer-run)

Importance of Local Park Districts

Having a local park district that operates separately from other taxing bodies is crucial for several reasons:

- Focused Governance: A dedicated park district allows for specialized management of recreational facilities and programs, ensuring that decisions are made with the community's recreational needs in mind.
- Tailored Services: Local Park districts can develop programs and services that reflect the specific interests and demographics of their communities, fostering greater community engagement and satisfaction.
- 3. **Efficient Resource Allocation**: Operating independently allows park districts to allocate resources specifically for recreation and community programs without competing for funding with schools, municipalities, or other entities.
- 4. **Increased Accountability**: A separate governing body enhances accountability to the community, as residents can directly participate in decision-making processes and hold park district officials responsible for their management of public spaces.
- 5. **Enhanced Funding Opportunities**: Independent Park districts often have access to specific grants and funding opportunities tailored for recreational services, allowing them to improve facilities and expand programs without burdening local taxpayers.

Public Engagement

The Dieterich Park District values community feedback and encourages residents to communicate with board members. The public has many opportunities to provide both positive and negative feedback. We meet every month on the **second Wednesday at 6:00 PM** at the **Dieterich Village Hall**. Current Programs Offered

The Dieterich Park District provides a variety of recreational programs, including:

- T-Ball
- Baseball
- Softball
- Soccer
- Pickleball
- Basketball

Future Program Opportunities: We are exploring the potential to offer additional programs, such as tennis and fishing.

Service and Intergovernmental Agreements

Currently, we do not have any formal service agreements, as all operations are conducted inhouse by our dedicated volunteers.

Intergovernmental Cooperation:

Our park district has enhanced efficiency through collaboration with local entities:

- **Dieterich Unit 30 Schools**: We share the use of ball diamonds in the summer for T-Ball, Baseball, and Softball leagues, which saves rental costs. We cover the outside lighting bill during the summer months.
- Village of Dieterich: We have a priority rental agreement for the Wright Family Center for our basketball and winter pickleball leagues, reducing our rental costs.

Examples of Efficient Operations

- Our operations are exclusively volunteer based, allowing for community engagement without the burden of employee costs.
- We actively seek sponsorships for our leagues to lessen the financial burden on taxpayers.
- Collaboration with neighboring park districts allows us to reduce travel costs for families participating in games.

Achievements and Community Impact

Over the past decade, we have successfully introduced soccer, basketball, and pickleball leagues. Our intergovernmental agreement for the Wright Family Center has been instrumental in expanding our basketball program. We prioritize timely communication with residents and have expanded our district by annexing more households.

The Dieterich Park District provides essential recreational activities, fostering physical health, social interaction, and community cohesion. Our parks serve as safe spaces for youth, promoting teamwork and personal development.

Additionally, our activities enhance property values, attract visitors, and support local businesses, contributing to economic vitality.

Challenges Due to State Inefficiencies

Local park districts face several challenges exacerbated by state inefficiencies, including:

- **Funding Delays**: Budget issues at the state level can delay necessary financial support, impacting planning and programming.
- **Complex Grant Processes**: The cumbersome nature of state grant applications can deter local park districts from seeking vital funding.
- **Inconsistent Policies**: Frequent changes in state policies create uncertainty and complicate long-term planning for park districts.
- **Inadequate Representation**: Local park districts often feel their concerns are not adequately represented, leading to misaligned policies that do not address local needs.

These inefficiencies hinder our ability to effectively serve our communities and impact residents' access to recreational opportunities.
